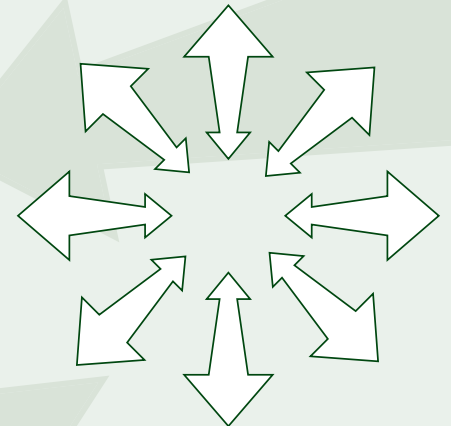

What is the Consortium?

The Southern Regional Faculty and Instructional Development Consortium (SRFIDC) is an organization of faculty and instructional development programs (teaching centers, instructional technology centers, faculty development committees, etc.) and professionals in two- and four-year degree-granting institutions in the greater South. Units in member institutions typically:

- focus on improving instructional effectiveness,
- have assigned staff,
- are funded, at least in part, by the institution, and
- offer services such as teaching enrichment workshops, consultations, mentoring programs, instructional technology support, etc.

What are the Goals of the Consortium?

The purpose of the Consortium is to foster the effectiveness and advancement of faculty and instructional development programs, both nascent and well established, with the ultimate goal of enhancing the quality of teaching and learning. The Consortium directs its efforts toward promoting fellowship and sharing in these specific ways.

- Exchanging information on faculty and instructional development among member institutions.
- Providing professional development activities for faculty and instructional development personnel.
- Engaging in cooperative projects for institutional change.

- Assisting institutions in the process of organizing instructional improvement or faculty development units or activities.
- Serving as a linking agent for identifying and/or pooling resources.
- Sharing successes and failures.

These activities provide the focus of the Consortium's Annual Sharing Conference, a three day meeting held in February or March and hosted by a member institution. It features brief workshops, major speakers, and member sharing sessions.

Who Can Belong?

SRFIDC offers either institutional membership or individual membership.

INSTITUTIONAL MEMBERSHIP:

An individual affiliated with such a unit may obtain membership for his/her institution. The institution, rather than the individual, becomes a member. One person from each institution serves as the contact person, but any number of individuals from a member institution may participate in Consortium activities. Institutional dues cover registration, session materials and notes, most meals (including the opening banquet), and social events for up to two representatives at the Annual Sharing Conference.

INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIP:

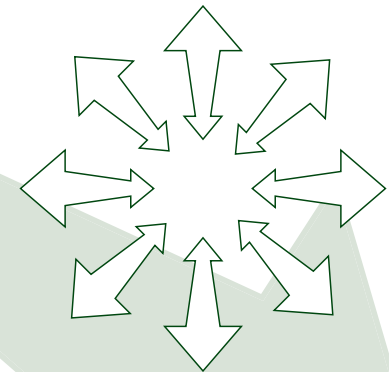
Any individual interested in faculty and instructional development may join. Individual membership dues cover registration, session materials and notes, most meals (including the opening banquet), and social events for the individual at the Annual Sharing Conference.

What are the Costs and Benefits of Membership?

Member benefits include registration, session materials and notes, most meals for the Annual Sharing Conference. Other membership benefits include SRFIDC listserv participation, and connections to and support of faculty and instructional developers in the region. In addition, the organization maintains a database of experts available for presentation and consultation.

Current institutional member dues are only \$250.00/year (July through June). Individual membership is \$175.00 per year.

As our logo graphically conveys, our joining together makes individual programs stronger.
